**Thursday, June 13, 6:00-8:00pm**

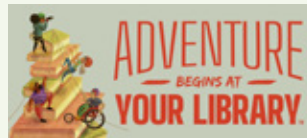

## Seed Library

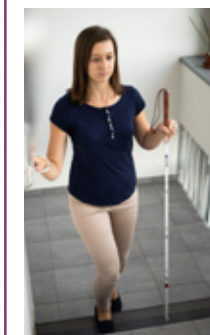
The library has more than 100 herb, vegetable, and flower seeds; available to patrons with a library card, four packets per visit.

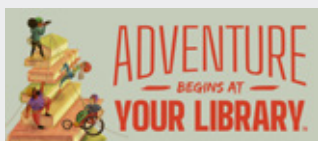

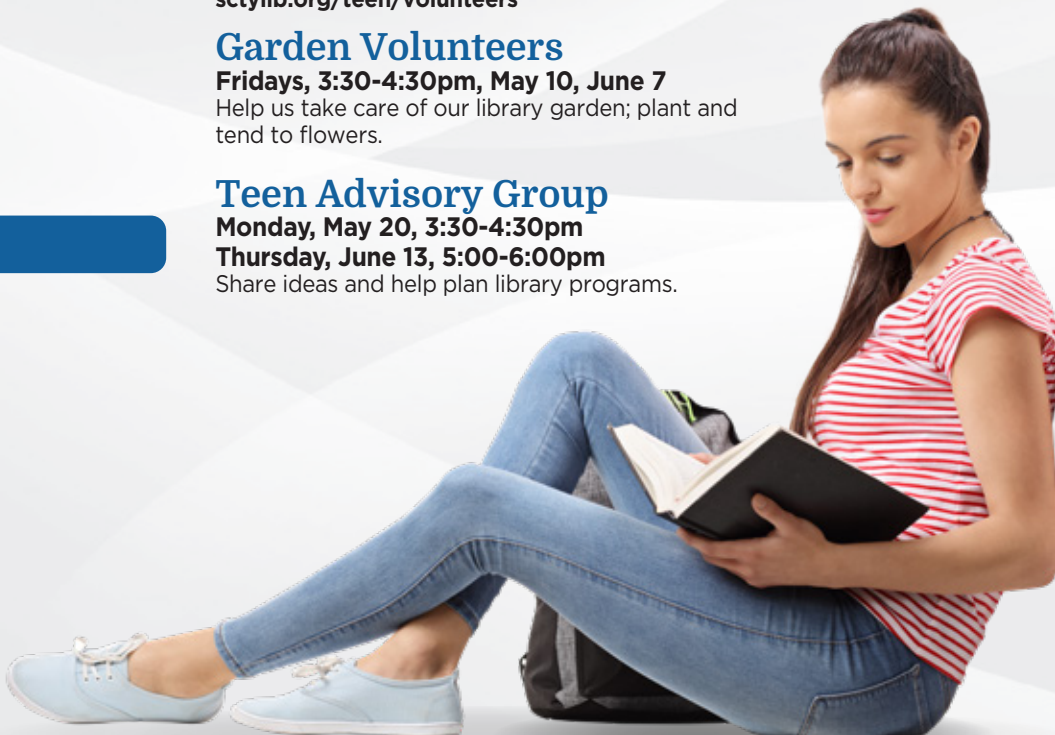
